विषय :- राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति-2020 के अध्यादेश में संशोधन के सम्बन्ध में,

महोदय / महोदया,

राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति—2020 के अध्यादेश जोकि विद्या परिषद की बैठक दिनांक 22.10.2021 में अनुमोदित किया गया था, में आ रही तकनीकी समस्याओं के दृष्टिगत रखते हुये निम्नलिखित संशोधन किया गया है :—

Revised provision under clause 7:

Clause 7.1 to 7.4 will remain unchanged whereas clause 7. 5 added which will be read as under:

7.5 The maximum duration of any programme shall be double to the actual duration of programme in accordance to admission rules of the university. For example, to get the UG degree the actual duration is three years and therefore any student will be allowed to get the UG degree in maximum of six years.

Revised provision under clause 13.2 (a), (b) and (c)

Clause (b) of existing provision omitted and clause (c) of existing provision amended as (b) with minor revision.

(a) At the end of each part, a student shall be awarded a Year Grade Point Average (YGPA) which shall be calculated as follows:

Sum of (Credits x Grade points) for all the Subjects of odd and even semesters of the part

YGPA =

Sum of (Credits) for all the Subjects of odd and even semesters of the part

(b) A student can be promoted to next part (academic year) if he/she fails in upto the maximum of FIVE CREDIT PAPERS (including both semesters of that part/year) only. The paper, in which a student is fail, shall be considered as back paper. However, in no case a student having back paper in more than FIVE CREDIT PAPERS can be promoted to next year. He/she can be promoted to final year even if he/she has cumulative back papers up to FIVE CREDIT PAPERS (in parts I&II). Further the theory and practical shall be considered as separate papers.

Revised provision under 13.2 (e)

13.2(e) Grace Marks:

A student can take a benefit of total **03 grace** marks (**in each semester**) to be distributed between maximum of **two subjects** for passing the examinations in each semester or promotion to the next year with a maximum of 05 carryovers of previous year/years only. However, benefit of Grace shall not be available for carry over subjects, if he/she fails to clear the min the next year also. There sult shall be declared indicating the Grace marks & he/she shall not be entitled for honors. The Grace marks shall not be counted for calculation of Grade/SGPA/YGPA/CGPA.

Revised provisions under 13.2(f)

13.2(f) Examination for carry over subjects:

- i. A student promoted to next year with carryover of maximum five theory credit papers (theory and Lab subjects will be treated as separate papers) shall be allowed to appear in the examination of relevant subjects in back paper examination. The Sessional marks which he/she had obtained as a regular student in the relevant subject will be carried as such.
- ii. A student shall be promoted to next part if he/she has allowed carryovers of 05 back papers in the previous parts (as per clause 13.2 (b)
- iii. In such cases the new grade(s) obtained by the student will replace the old grade(s).

Revised provision under Clause 13.2 (i)

13.2 (i) Classification of Results:

(i) On the basis of the CGPA, the result of each student shall be declared as follows: -

CGPA	RESULT
(a). 8.0 and above, provided he/she	Passed in First Division with Honors
has Passed all the Parts in a	
single attempt	
(b). 6.0and above, but excluding(a)	Passed in First Division
(c). 4.5and above, but less than 6.0	Passed in Second Division
(d). 3.5 and above but less than 4.5	Passed in third Division
(d). Below 3.5	Failed

Note: Further in light of New Education Policy (NEP-2020) and implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), it may be required to make suitable modifications/ amendments as and when some issue arises in practical execution of any norms of the said ordinance. Taking a note of it and in accordance with the spirit of academic council meeting dated 22-10-2021 (point no.6), The committee recommends strongly that Hon'ble Vice Chancellor may constitute a suitable committee at any point of time to amend/revise any of the existing provisions of ordinance as and when required taking into consideration the interest of students in mass.
